<u> Year 1 Communication</u>

Smarter	1. To re-engage fully with parents.
Targets	 2. Establishment of effective two-way communication between families and school. 3. The promotion of effective ways to support family involvement in their child/children's overall wellbeing, learning and development.
Actions	 Ensure a welcoming school climate. Encourage as many parents as possible to attend parent-teacher meetings. Continue to offer parents opportunities to attend events in our school by ensuring suitable times, dates etc Continue to operate an "open door" policy for parents/guardians. Inform parents/guardians about school activities/programmes by creating a "Parents information" hub on school website and continuing our Parents Newsletter. Organise an "information evening" for parents of all new entrants in mid-September. Develop a "Tips for Parents" section on school website. Stress importance of Homework diary as a constant source of communication. Establish an email messaging system for relaying school messages.
Monítoríng	 Monitor feedback from parents at Parent Teacher meetings. Check homework dairy regularly. Send a questionnaire to all parents to determine their views on how effective the lines of communication are in the Commons N.S. and seek suggestions for improving these.
Evaluation	Evaluate responses from Questionnaire and feedback at Parent teacher meetings and act accordingly. Thank you and affirming parents for their support throughout the year at school.

<u>Year 2</u> <u>Learníng at home</u>

Targets	 Involve families with their children in academic learning at home, including homework, goal setting and other curriculum related activities. Encourage teachers to design homework that enables students to share and discuss interesting tasks.
Actions	 Build on Year 1 actions to ensure clear lines of communication exist. Make parents aware of the resources available to support their child's learning at school. (NCCA resources on website) Encourage project type tasks for homework termly where parent and child can easily and enjoyably collaborate. Paired reading activities for homework to enhance Literacy skills. (Read at home books). Ensure homework is "at pupils" level and always provide clear instruction. Question parents/pupils about initiatives that worked well, were beneficial and areas that need improving.
Monítoríng	 Create a Reading Diary Log for 2-way communication. Monitor homework diary, comments section, regularly. Be aware that work sent home is suitable for that pupil (no one size fits all).
Evaluation	Look at feedback and see what worked well.

<u>Year 3</u> <u>Volunteeríng.</u>

Targets	 Improve recruitment, training, activities and schedules to involve families as volunteers and as audiences at the school or in other locations. Enable teachers to work with volunteers who support students and the school. To increase involvement of families that volunteer at school from 3 times in 2025 to 8 times by 2027.
Actions	To provide all parents with a list of school events/activities that they can choose to actively participate in/help out with (at start of each school year). 1. Sponsored walk - monitors 2. St Brigid's Day - Cross making 3. School Nativity Play - Ushers/Chairs etc 4. Bake Sale/Tea morning 5. Sports Day 6. Sporting events 7. Sacramental preparation 8. Quiz participation 9. Fund raising activities 10. School Tour
